WHERE DO THE ADIRONDACKS GO FROM HERE?

You've been hearing quite a lot about the Adirondacks lately. Especially, if you're like me, and love the area so much that your ears prick up everytime the word is mentioned.

Look at it this way — it is time to plan ahead for the Adirondacks. If nothing is done, what will the area be 10 years, or 20 years from now? The signs of destruction — overuse of certain areas and hony-tonk development — are already here!

The Adirondack Park, some six million acres — an area the size of Vermont — is now considered the greatest treasure trove east of the Mississippi. Those of us who like to catch a trout, hunt the sneaky whitetail, climb a mountain, canoe a wilderness stream, or camp under a fragrant spruce have known this all along.

The new report does not propose any change in the "forever wild" concept of the preserve lands. It does attempt to save the wilderness qualities of the entire region from uncontrolled development on private lands and overuse of state lands.

The Commission has recommended that a viable forest industry be maintained in the park. But it is against building more dams and lakes for water supply in the Adirondacks. Some nature study centers would be built, and park-goers would be attracted to lesser used regions to take pressure off the ecology of the high peaks.

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School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday evening, May 10, 1971 by Mr. Horan, President of the Board of Education. Mr. Kessler and the following Board Members were present: Dr. Walker, Mr. Tuttle, Mr. Stephens and Mrs. Slade.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read for approval. Motion to approve these was made by Mr. Stephens, seconded by Mr. Tuttle and passed by 5 votes of yes.

Mr. Kessler read the bills for the month of April 1971 — \$9,443.33 plus gas and electric. Mrs. Slade made the motion that these be paid. Mr. Walker seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Title II Basic Grant Warrant was read for approval. The amount was \$14.39. Mrs. Slade made the motion that these be paid. Seconded by Dr. Walker. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Unigrant Title II bills were read for approval. Amount — \$1,272.45. Mr. Tuttle made the motion that these be paid. Mrs. Slade seconded motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's report was read for approval. Mr. Stephens made the motion that this report be accepted as read. Mr. Tuttle seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report was read by Mr. Kessler showing a net loss of \$648.79 for the month of April. A motion was made by Dr. Walker to file this report with the minutes. Seconded by Mr. Tuttle. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The gross payrolls were read for approval of the Board. The total was \$44,018.08. Mrs. Slade made the motion to accept these as read and Mr. Tuttle seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The minutes of the Special meeting were read for approval. Error of 120 miles was changed to the correct 1200 miles figure. Mr. Stephens moved and Alan Tuttle seconded. Carried by 5 votes of yes for approval.

Dr. Walker made the motion that the Bus Bid of Russ Davis Motor Sales, Inc., as follows be accepted contingent on voters approval at the Annual Meeting. Mr. Alan Tuttle seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The resignation of Mr. Michael Brace was accepted. Mrs. Slade made the motion to accept and Mr. Tuttle seconded. Carried by 5 yes votes.

The new Social Studies Teacher to succeed Mr. Brace. Mr. Tuttle made the motion and Mr. Stephens seconded. Carried by 5 yes votes.

A motion was made by Mr. Tuttle that Mrs. Mulconry be allowed to extend the Tax roll. Seconded by Mrs. Slade. Carried by 5 yes votes.

Dr. Walker moved that the meeting be adjourned at 9:45. Mr. Tuttle seconded. Carried by 5 yes votes.

An Andover Community Festival of Hymns will be held at the Andover United Methodist Church at 7:30 p. m. Sunday (May 16).

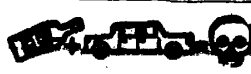
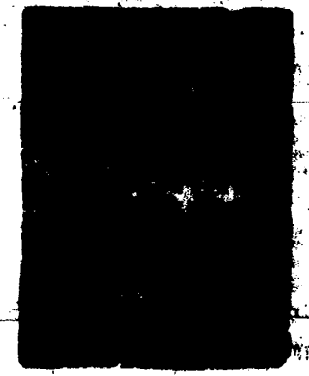
Hymns from the various eras of the Christian Church will be explained and sung.
