Robert H. McNinch Announces Candidacy For Allegany County Sheriff

County Legislator Robert H. McNinch, Belmont, N. Y., announces that he will be a candidate for Republican nomination for the position of Allegany County Sheriff.

Mr. McNinch, currently serving his second year as Allegany County Legislator for District 5, has been associated with Town and County government for 18 years. McNinch served five years as Justice of the Peace previous to six years as Town of Amity Supervisor. When Allegany County reapportioned, he was elected to the Board of Legislators and served one year as majority leader.

A native of Belmont, McNinch was graduated from Belmont Central School and has attended training courses held at the University of Buffalo for magistrates. He, also, has attended short courses at Erie County Technical Institute at Buffalo.

Mr. McNinch states: "I am familiar with Allegany County activities and resources and feel I maintain a good working relationship with law enforcement agencies in this county. I am particularly interested in good, economical governmental procedures. My experience in the field of management and administration I believe, will be advantageous in maintaining an efficient Sheriff's Department in Allegany County."

LIVING UNDER LAW

TAX AUDIT

The income tax audit these days is quite common. If you have kept accurate and complete records, and have filed correct returns, you have little to worry about. But for those with incomplete records, the audit can bring problems. It may lead to a deficiency assessment, a penalty, or in the case where there has been a willful failure to report income, a criminal charge.

If one's return is audited what should he do? He should be helpful. But he need not give up all his legal rights to do so. As a rule, if a special agent is making the investigation, he is looking for fraud and you should seek counsel to advise you early in the investigation. A general tax auditor usually makes a routine check.

Our Constitution protects all persons from giving testimony against himself in a criminal case, but it does not exempt one's business records from examination. Un-

der the law, every taxpayer has to keep records which the Internal Revenue agent may see. He can see them only if they are "relevant or material to the inquiry." Your lawyer can advise you which records are properly open to him.

Once an agent examines a record with the taxpayer's consent, anything in it can be used against the taxpayer. If the taxpayer says anything to the agent, he had better tell the truth. Making false statements to the agent is a serious crime.

Much of an audit does not directly involve looking at the taxpayer's own records. The investigators may open the records of banks, business associates, customers or others. Their records must be made available.

Keep full records for at least four years. Keep complete cost records on capital assets, such as stocks, on your home, plus all additions. Better yet, seven. On capital assets, like your home, keep all your records for four years after any sale. Keep records of any tax loss carry-over for at least four years after the loss is exhausted.
