**Postal Rate Increases**

Increases in most postal rates will take effect May 16 as required by the Postal Reorganization Act. First Class letter rates will raise from 6 to 8 cents an ounce, and airmail letter rates from 10 to 11 cents an ounce. Post Cards will go from 5 to 6 cents each and airmail post cards will go from 8 to 9 cents each.

The new rates also make changes in other postage rate categories and special service fees, such as special delivery and registered mail. New second and third class mailing rates are also effective May 16.

No changes are made in the rates for parcel post, known as fourth class mail. However, increases will be made in the "book rate" which is classified as fourth class
