

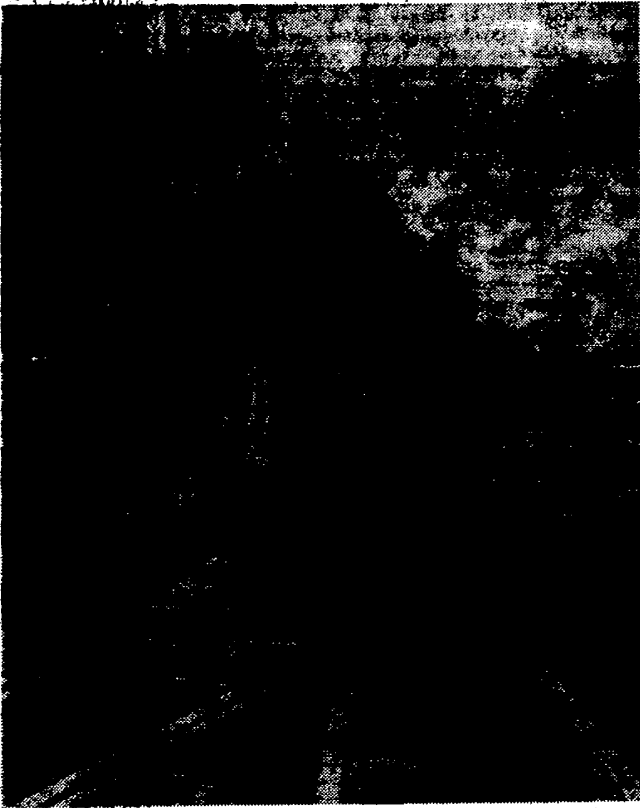

E. Willard Barnes Former Publisher Dies Suddenly

E. Willard Barnes, 85, died Sunday morning at Jones Memorial Hospital following a heart attack suffered Saturday at his home on O'Donnell Road, Shongu.

A native and lifelong resident of Wellsville and Allegany County, Mr. Barnes was born on April 29, 1906, the son of the late E. Willard and Lillian Lee Barnes. Since 1952 he and his widow, Mary P. Barnes, have made their home in Shongu. They had returned from their winter home in Englewood, Florida only a week ago.

Mr. Barnes until his semi-retirement in 1964 had been publisher of the Wellsville Daily Reporter. The firm was founded in 1880 by his grandfather, the late Enos W. Barnes. Upon the death of the founder in 1888, the business, which included an active commercial printing operation as well as the newspaper, was carried on by the founder's widow and sons, E. Willard and Charles M. Barnes.

Upon his father's death in 1925, Mr. Barnes joined the staff of the Daily Reporter Company and together with his mother, purchased the interest held by Charles M. Barnes in 1929. Mr. Barnes served as editor and co-publisher with his mother until her death in 1951, after which he served as president and publisher of the corporation.

In July 1964, Mr. Barnes sold the Daily Reporter including its commercial printing operation to its present owner, but remained as a member of the firm's board of directors and active participant in the firm's affairs until his death.

Besides his widow, the former Mary Pegelow of Medina, he is survived by a sister, Mrs. Humphrey Stevens of Williamsville, and a niece, Mrs. Thomas Voasler of Columbus, Ga., and a nephew, James H. Stevens of Wellsville.

Services were held at 10 a. m. Wednesday in St. John's Episcopal Church with the Rev. Thomas W. Murray, rector, officiating. Interment was in Woodlawn Cemetery.

Glenn B. Bowen

Glenn B. Bowen, 67 of R. D. 1, Salamanca, died at his home Tuesday, June 1, 1971, following a long illness.

Born January 25, 1904, in the Town of Mansfield, N. Y., he was the son of Frank and Lillie Burlingame Bowen. He was married Oct. 14, 1928 to the former Edith Brown who survives.

Mr. Bowen was a graduate of the Ellicottville High School and then worked as a clerk for the Walter Alwiler Grocery Store in Ellicottville and later worked for the K. M. Reynolds as a clerk in their store from 1923 - 1940, at which time he purchased the Reynolds Store, which he and his wife operated until 1946. At that time he sold it to Howard Ahrens of Salamanca.

He drove school bus in Ellicottville for nine years. Then worked for the Cattaraugus County Sheriff Department as a night radio dispatcher for eight years.

From 1957 to 1968 he worked for the Van Rensselaer Funeral Home in Little Valley, retiring in 1968 on account of illness.

Mr. Bowen was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Ellicottville and a member of the Ellicottville Masonic Lodge No. 307 F. & A. M.

Other survivors are two sisters, Mrs. Warren Ahrens of Andover and Miss Annabel Bowen of Little Valley and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held Friday, June 4, at the Van Rensselaer Funeral Home in Little Valley at 11 a. m., with the Rev. Robert W. Barrett, Pastor of the Ellicottville Presbyterian Church, officiating. Burial will be in Sunset Hill Ellicottville.

The Ellicottville Masonic Lodge will have a Memorial Service Thursday at 7:30 p. m. at the Funeral Home.

ACS students, under the guidance of "Al" Barden, set out the new "planter boxes" which they built under a "crash program" so they could be placed along Main Street prior to Memorial Day.

The lumber was furnished by the Andover Chamber of Commerce but was delivered so late that the students had to make an "all out" effort to get them completed in three days to meet the deadline. Due to the high cost of the lumber, only enough planters were built at this time to replace the former ones that were unserviceable.

However, it is planned to replace all of the old boxes as soon as funds and time are available. Merchants are asked to water the "posies" in front of their stores so that the "beautification plan" won't have been made in vain.
