

A SYMBOLIC "HOUSE OF HOPE" An Editorial

The Allegany County Senior Citizens Informational Center, Inc., is embarked on a Symbolic "House of Hope" fund raising campaign which will allow the Center to continue in operation for another 3-year span.

The pilot program during its first three year term has set up the Center and 14 Satellite Centers to serve the County which together have handled over 3,000 cases for the aging, many of them emergencies.

Over 100 Foster Friends, Agencies, and up to 50 Churches and Organizations have become involved in service to the Aging which have achieved the following results — referrals on: — Employment — over 200; Legal — over 90; Finance — over 90; Housing — over 120; Health — over 350; Social Services — over 125; Social Security — over 180; Personal and Family — over 1,150; Transportation and errands — over 750, etc.

More than 200 Merchants, Service Organizations, area Schools and Colleges have endorsed the Dollar Stretcher Plan. The participants in this large group of interested Business People grant discounts of 10% or over to more than 3,500 Allegany County Senior Citizens Residents with I. D. Cards (age 65 and over) which, at an average of only \$1 per week in savings, could amount to as much as \$180,000 for just one year.

The restricted income of the 5-man "Green Thumb Crew" employed in County-wide highway and park beautification projects, has brought a total added income of \$1,000 per month to our County's economy.

In addition, a Telephone Service by Volunteers on daily 1 to 1 calls to the aging and shut-ins have reassured them that if they cannot be reached by phone, an emergency visit will be made.

What has been the cost of this project for the past 3 years? This is no secret and, according to the Budget Analysis Table: Actual expenditures for 1st Fiscal Year starting 7/1/68 — \$27,529; through the 3rd Fiscal Year ending 6/30/71 — \$32,810.

The proposed Budget for the next 3-year plan starts with \$34,779 for the 1st Fiscal Year 7/1/71 and ends with \$37,979 for the 3rd Fiscal Year ending 6/3/74, which allows for a projected increase in supplies, etc., of 9.2% over the next 3 years.

Here is the Budget Recapitulation for the Fiscal Year of 71 - 72: Coordinator — \$10,261; Asst. Coordinator — \$5,830; Secretary — \$5,130; Client & Resource Supervisor — \$1,620; Indirect Expense — \$1,853; Equipment — \$520; Supplies — \$800; Postage — \$765; Travel — \$2,300; Telephone & Telegraph — \$1,300; Rent & Utilities — \$1,800; Printing & Duplicating — \$500; Advertising & Publicity — \$1,900; Bookkeeping — \$180; amounting to a total of \$34,779. And, of course, down at each local level, there are all of those good-hearted, civic minded workers who contribute their time and expense at no cost for, without their help, the program would be practically impossible.

The Allegany County Senior Citizens Informational Center, Inc., is set up to operate for the next three years purely on a voluntary contribution basis of interested Citizens — at no cost to Local, County, State, or Federal Taxpayers.

Do you think that the program is worthwhile? Do you think that our local County Senior Citizens should be given a "Helping Hand" with their needs in our fast advancing and complex modern society? — This is not relief! — Nor Welfare! This is just a "Helping Hand" by interested local Citizens!

Public Notice For Hearing On Public Peace And Good Order Ordinance of the Village of Andover

A public hearing will be held at the Village Hall in the Village of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y., on the 10th day of June 1971, between the hours of 7 P. M. and 9 P. M. for the following proposed ordinance on public peace and good order of the Village of Andover.

All interested persons will be heard at the said time and place.

The following is a copy of the proposed ordinance on public peace and good order of the Village of Andover:

Section 1.

No person or persons shall be in an intoxicated condition or drunk upon or in any street, public places, or any public building in the village, or participate in any riotous and tumultuous assemblages in any street or public place in the village, or unnecessarily assemble upon the streets or in the doorways or stairways adjacent thereto, or loiter about such places in the village or be guilty of any disorderly, riotous or tumultuous conduct within the village and thereby disturbing the peace and quiet of the village or any meeting or assemblage therein.

Section 2.

A penalty of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) is hereby prescribed for each violation of this ordinance, and such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

Public Notice For Hearing On Fast Driving Ordinance of the Village of Andover

A public hearing will be held at the Village Hall in the Village of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y., on the 10th day of June 1971, between the hours of 7 P. M. and 9 P. M. for the following proposed ordinance on fast driving of the Village of Andover.

All interested persons will be heard at the said time and place.

The following is a copy of the proposed ordinance on fast driving of the Village of Andover:

Section 1.

No person shall ride or drive any animal in an immoderate manner, nor have any horse untied or hitched an unreasonable time in the streets or public grounds, nor drive any animal on any sidewalk therein, nor operate any motor vehicle on any public highway in a reckless manner.

Reckless driving for the purpose of this and the ensuing section shall include driving or using any motor vehicle or motorcycle or any appliance or accessory thereof in a manner which unnecessarily interferes with free and proper use of the streets of the village or unnecessarily endangers users of such streets.

Section 2.

A penalty of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) is hereby prescribed for each violation of this ordinance, and such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

Public Notice For Hearing On An Amusement Ordinance of the Village of Andover

The following is a copy of the proposed ordinance on amusements of the Village of Andover:

Section 1.

No person shall coast, play ball or engage in any act, amusement

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or practice endangering property or persons on the streets or public grounds. But coasting and games may be permitted on the streets and public grounds, under proper regulations fixed by the board of trustees.

Section 2.

A penalty of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) is hereby prescribed for each violation of this ordinance, and such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

Public Notice For Hearing On An Incumbering The Streets Ordinance of the Village of Andover

A public hearing will be held at the Village Hall in the Village of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y., on the 10th day of June 1971, between the hours of 7 P. M. and 9 P. M. for the following proposed ordinance on incumbering the streets of the Village of Andover.

All interested persons will be heard at the said time and place.

The following is a copy of the proposed ordinance on incumbering the streets of the Village of Andover:

Section 1.

No person shall incumber any street, sidewalk or public ground with any material, nor have thereon any horse, team, automobile, truck or other vehicle so as to obstruct the passage in said street except as may be permitted by proper regulations fixed by the board of trustees.

Section 2.

No encroachment or projection in, over, or upon any of the streets or public grounds, or any excavations in or immediately adjacent thereto shall be permitted except by proper regulations fixed by the board of trustees.

Section 3.

Every owner or occupant of a plot or parcel of land bounded by any street shall cause all hedges, trees, shrubs, or other vegetation to be kept trimmed in such a manner and any walls or walks to be constructed in such a manner, that the said hedges, trees, shrubs, or other vegetation, walls or walks will not (a) encroach over the property line of any street or of Village property in such manner as to interfere with or annoy the pedestrians or others lawfully using such street or property; (b) obstruct the light from the street lights or (c) obstruct the view of approaching traffic on intersecting streets, or (d) obstruct the street or property in such a manner so as to hinder the removal of snow, or other materials, or the repair of any street or property, and when notified by the Village of a violation of the foregoing, shall remove such violation forthwith. In the event that any of the above conditions exist after ten (10) days notice by the Village, the Village may trim said trees or hedges, etc., or remove said walls or walks, and charge the cost of such trimming or removal to the taxes of the premises.

Every owner of land adjacent to the street shall trim all trees in said street in front thereof so that no part of any branch thereof shall be less than fourteen feet from the ground.

Section 2.

No person or persons shall in any negligent, willful or malicious manner injure or destroy any

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shade tree in the streets or public grounds in the village.

Section 3.

A penalty of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) is hereby prescribed for each violation of these ordinances, designated as sections 1 and 2, and such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

No telephone, telegraph or electric light pole shall be erected nor any wires strung in, over or upon the streets or public grounds or upon, over or in front of any building or buildings except as may be permitted by proper regulations of the board of trustees.

Section 2.

A penalty of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) is hereby prescribed for each violation of this ordinance and such violations shall constitute disorderly conduct, and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.
