Chairman Lee R. Ryan (D-Dist. V) called a meeting of the Allegany County Professional Advisory Committee May 25, 1971. The Committee received a report from Mrs. Margaret D. Connelly, Supervising Nurse and Mrs. Thomas (Joan) Cameron, Registered Professional Nurse of the Public Health Nursing Service concerning the Amblyopia Program recently established. The Lions Club in Allegany County will be working with the nursing service in providing screening sessions for the purpose of detection of Amblyopia or the "Lazy Eye" in pre-school children. The earlier the age this condition is detected the more favorable correction is achieved.

The Committee performed the bi-annual evaluation of the Home Health Agency under the direction of Mrs. Margaret D. Connelly, Supervising Nurse of the Public Health Nursing Service. Mrs. Connelly explained to the Committee that the purpose of this evaluation is to determine whether or not the Home Health Agency is accomplishing its goals and objectives initially established and to set future goals and objectives.

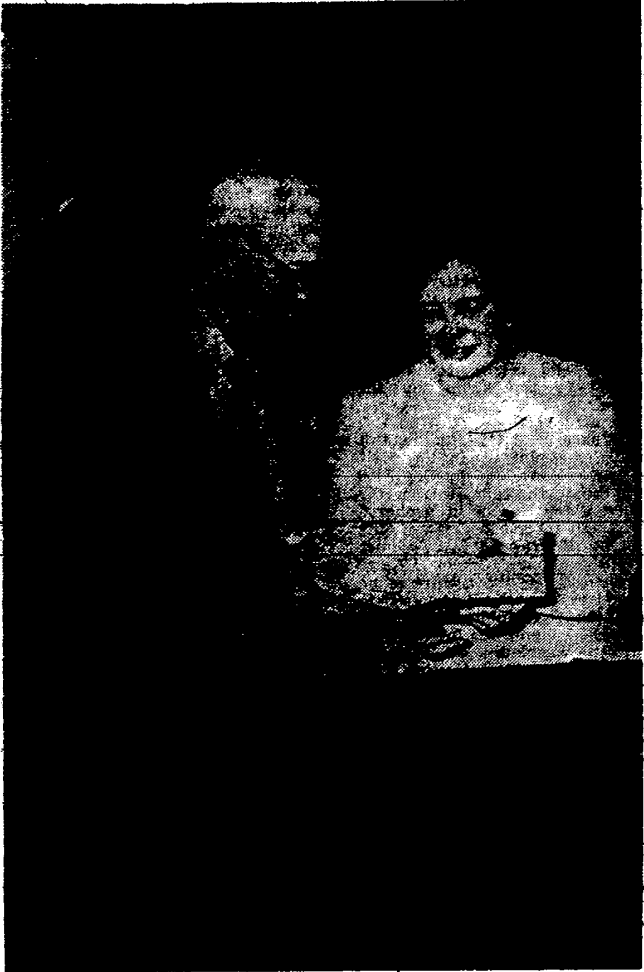
