Pool Schedule Announced

The YMCA has released the summer pool schedule for the Community Outdoor Pool on East Pearl Street, Wellsville. The schedule includes a free instructional period Monday-Friday, 9:30 - 11:00 AM.

There will be a free recreational swim 11:00 - 12:00 Noon Monday-Saturday, for all ages of youth. The afternoon recreational swim is scheduled according to grades: Monday-Saturday, Grades 1, 2, 3, will swim 1:30-3:00 PM.

An added program this year is an adults recreational swim period, Monday-Wednesday-Friday, 18:00-1:00 PM.

The Monday-Friday, 7:00-7:45 P. M. recreational swim is for families and adults. All youth attending family swim must be accompanied by one of their own parents.

Special parties for Community groups can be scheduled by reservation by calling the YMCA. They can be scheduled any time there is not another program.

Rates for use of the swimming pool are \$25.00 for a family season ticket, \$17.50 for an adult season ticket, \$7.50 for a youth season ticket.
