

The provisions of the forgoing sections of this ordinance shall not be construed to require the obtaining of a license or permit by a person who is the bona fide twings or lessee and occupant of a store, shop, warehouse, factory or other place of business within the village, for the sale, distribution, storage or manufacture of any of the goods, wares and merchandise or other personal property, or where such work labor and services can be or are intended to be personal or the sale. or are intended to be per

formed.

The peddling of meats, fish, fruits and farm produce by farmers and persons who produce such commodities and the hawking or peddling by an abordable discharged soldier, safter or marine who is crippled as a result of injuries received while in the naval military service of the United tates or who is the holder of a license grapted under Section 32 of the General Business Law are excepted from any of the provisions of this ordinance. of this ordinance. Section 7.

Any person who shall violate any provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a penalty of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each and every offense and each separate day that this ordinance is separate day that this ordinance is violated shall be considered a separate offense and in addition there to it is hereby ordinate that a violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute disorderly conduct and any person violating the same shall be a discretely person property of the conduct of the orderly person. Section 8.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. Section 9.

In case any section, paragraph or provision of this ordinance shall be a court of connectat jurisdiction is declared invalid. The following is a copy of the proposed gublic nuisance ordinance of the Village of Andover:

Section 1. Section 1.

No person shall do anything or knowingly maintain any condition upon the premises owned or occu-pied by such person, which shall endanger the public health, disturb public comfort, or offend public Section 2.

A penalty of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) is hereby prescribed for each violation of this ordinance, and such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct, and any person violating the same shall be a disorderly person. STATE OF NEW YORK
