An old landmark, the Greenwood Town Highway barn was destroyed by fire Thursday. It was the former Greenwood Union Free High School built about 1885. The Town took over the building for a highway shop and garage after the school district was centralized in 1936. Fire believed to have started from an explosion shortly after

noon, completely burned the building. Lost in the blaze were a three year old FWD dump truck that had cost \$29,500 when new; a station wagon belonging to Mrs. Dorothy Puffer; many tools including a welder, greasers and shop equipment. Two pick-up trucks parked near the building were lost. They belonged to Earl Spencer and Don Edwards, Town Highway employees. Seymour Heckman and Mrs. Puffer were in the building. He was welding a trailer hitch on the Puffer car when there was an explosion. They were barely able to leave the building before it was engulfed in flames.

The highway crew was at work on the Mitchell Hill Road on West Greenwood. Most of the trucks and equipment were away from the barns at the work site. Gas, oil and grease containers continued to explode during the height of the fire and the old pine building was quick to burn. Greenwood Firemen were assisted by Canistota and Jasper Fire Departments under Mutual Aid. Water was pumped from the nearby creek after the water flow was damed by the firemen. The old building held memories for many area people.

Greenwood firemen were at the scene throughout the evening wetting down the smoldering ruins. The building had \$7,000 fire insurance, the contents \$3,000 and the large dump truck by \$14,500. The Spencer, Edwards and Puffer vehicles also had fire insurance. The Town insurance agent investigated Friday. The Greenwood Town
