The theme of the Celebration "From Indian Trails To Outer Space", was in strong evidence and portrayed in the many beautiful floats that were in the parade which lasted around an hour and drew over 3,000 people from Andover and the vicinity.

"Jim" Mulholland, who was General Chairman of the whole deal, is to be commended on the amount of effort put into the project as well as the results obtained.

John Murray, Chairman of the Parade Committee, took care of his part in fine shape with the Parade starting just about on the scheduled time. The Parade Committee composed of: Mel Mickie, Doris Annson, Frank and Anita Cahill, Soud Glover, Ronnie Kemp, Jim Mickie, Ken Lehman, Dale and Diane Ordiway, Kathleen Murray, Larry and Lyvonne Ryckman and Stan Ormsby, representatives of various local organizations, raised their own funds for the trophies and other parade expenses.

The "Queen Contest" was the same as last year, with the winner not being announced until just before the parade in front of the judging stand.

Patricia Dibble was crowned Queen by Maureen Thorp, last year's Queen with Jack King from Canisteo a member of the planning committee in Alfred, and one of the Parade Judges, presenting the new Queen with a beautiful bouquet. Charlene McCormick, Kathleen Gayin and Jeanne Atwell were the "runners-up" in the contest and were the "Queens" Attendants.

Mel Mickie was Grand Marshal of the Parade, with both the Crowning of the Queen and the Parade being broadcast live over Radio Station WLSV.

Following the parade, a tasty Chicken Bar-B-Q Dinner was served to around 1,400 patrons by the Andover Rod & Gun Club members. The afternoon program included rides, games, ballgames and water fight competition among area fire companies.

The fireworks display in the evening drew an estimated 8,000 to 10,000 viewers in the largest crowd to date with the show lasting around an hour and the display being fired in rapid succession without any problems.

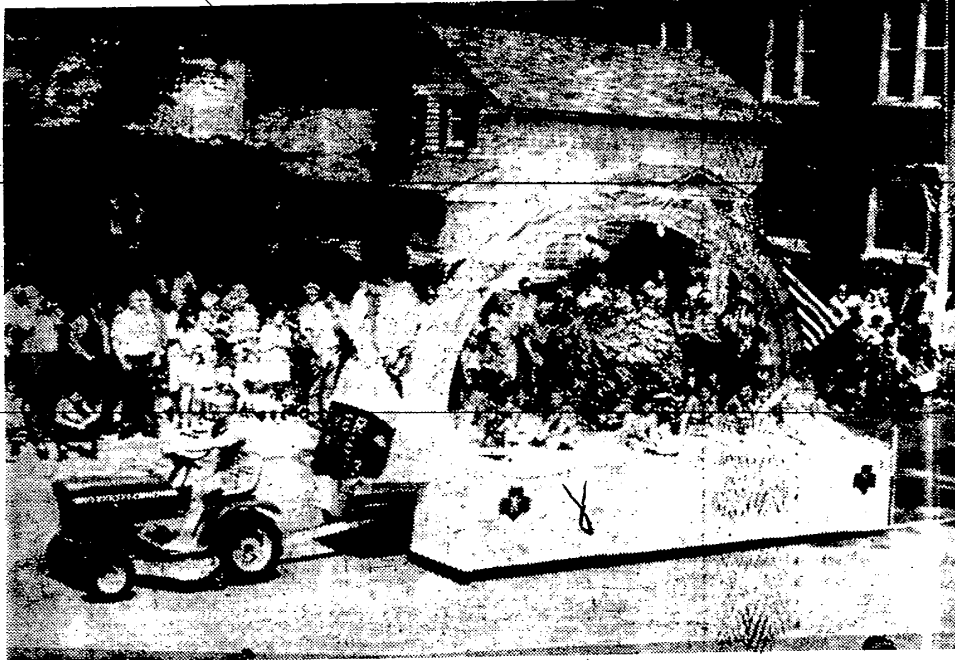
Rod & Gun Club Meeting Friday, July 16th
