A motion was made that Geraldine Oakes be nominated as Tax Collector. Motion made by William Walker and seconded by Mary K. Slade. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made that Dr. Folsom be appointed as School Doctor. Motion made by William Walker and seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made that Dr. Common be appointed Dental Supervisor for the school. Motion made by Carl Atwell and seconded by Mary K. Slade. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made by Francis Horan that Doris Mulconery be made Petty Cashier. Seconded by Mary K. Slade. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made by Mary Slade that the Andover News be the official newspaper. Seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made and carried

that the monthly meeting night will be the second Monday evening of each month at 8:00. Carried by 4 votes of yes. Motion was made by William Walker and seconded by Carl Atwell.

Motion was made to authorize Mr. Weibezahl to purchase the Treasurer's Bond in the amount of \$200,000.00. Motion was made by Mary K. Slade and seconded by William Walker. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made to authorize Mr. Weibezahl to purchase the Collector's Bond in the amount of \$5,000.00 by Carl Atwell and seconded by Mary K. Slade. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made that William Walker be appointed to be the Board Teachers Representative. Motion was made by Francis Horan and seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

The motion was made that Mary K. Slade be nominated for Clerk of the Board of Education by Francis Horan and seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made by Mary K. Slade and seconded by Carl Atwell that Francis Horan be Vice-President of the Board of Education. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made by Carl Atwell to pay the utility bills and local bills for the month of June-July. Seconded by Mary K. Slade. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made by Mary K. Slade and seconded by William Walker that Payrolls for the Month of July be approved in the amount \$3,943.52. This covers only the payroll for the first half of July.

Proclamations By The Governor

August has been proclaimed by Governor Rockefeller as "Geneva Convention POW Observance Month" to focus public attention on the Convention's principles of treatment for prisoners of war and help build pressure for North Vietnam's compliance with them. "The Geneva Convention, of which North Vietnam is a signatory," the Governor said, "sets forth elementary and basic principles of humane care for prisoners of war, including identification of those captured, repatriation of sick and wounded prisoners, international inspection of prison facilities, and communication between the captured and their families."

Noting recent organization of the Council for Civilized Treatment of P.O.W.'s to press for compliance by North Vietnam with these conditions and its setting aside of the month of August "to focus public attention on this matter," the Governor declared:

"It is appropriate that all Americans demonstrate their sympathy with this cause."
