Well here we are back at Alfred Sta., for a few days after traveling through Eastern Canada.

Now we can say that we have been the entire length of the Trans-Canada Highway from the Gaspe Peninsula and Halifax, Nova Scotia to Vancouver, B. C.

On this trip our most interesting sights were on the Gaspe Peninsula and the Perce, P. Q.

The coast along the Perce is dotted with small fishing villages mostly for cod. You can tell when you get near a fishing village by the smell of fish. They have racks about 3 feet high which they place the cod on to dry.

At Perce just off the coast there is a large rock that extends up about 288 ft. high and is 1420 ft. long. Further out is Bonaventure Island with rock about 300 feet high, and the island covers about 300 acres. It being a bird sanctuary. The sides of the island is inhabited by several different kinds of birds. Crows, being on the upper elevation. Buffins along the sides and sea gulls and kites along the lower sides. We never saw so many birds in all our travels.

We came Southeast from there through Brunswick and into Maine.

Woodstock. Soon after entering Maine we ran into a bad storm but lived through it.

We expect to leave here soon for Labor Day for the warmer climates.
