A.C.S. Opening Day Schedule

Starting time for the opening year at Andover Central School was announced today by school officials. Faculty will report at 8:30 on Tuesday, September 7, for a general faculty meeting.

Children will attend school Tuesday afternoon for a short session. Buses will leave the bus garage for their pickups at 12:15 and arrive at school before 1:00. Youngsters who walk to school should arrive at 12:45. Children will need to have their lunch before leaving for school on Tuesday. Buses will depart for home at 2:30 and youngsters should be dropped off at their homes by 3:15.

The session Tuesday afternoon is for BOCES Occupational Ed students and all students who attend classes at the Andover Central School. Children who attend special classes in Belmont or Alfred-Almond will not start until Wednesday.

Beginning on Wednesday, September 8th, full day classes will be held for all children.

Parents of children who have not attended Andover school in the past are asked to come to the school office before the opening day to register their youngsters. They should bring birth certificates and any records they may have from their child's previous school.

Parents of all youngsters are also requested to review with them safety precautions in getting to and from the school. Kindergarten children should be shown the best route to school and instructed in crossing roads and highways if they walk to school. Youngsters who ride buses should be advised on safety precautions. In particular the following items should be stressed: (1) Wait quietly in line, well back from the road when the bus is approaching. (2) When you enter the bus, go directly to a seat, and stay in that seat until it is time to leave the bus. (3) Keep your hands and head inside the bus windows, and never throw paper, trash, or other articles from the bus. (4) Help your driver by helping to keep the bus clean and by demonstrating good manners. (5) When you leave the bus if you need to cross the street, cross in front of the bus and within the drivers' vision. (6) Your behavior on the bus is noticed by adults. Make a good impression for your school.
