Title II Unigrant bills in the amount of \$444.18 were read for approval. Dr. Walker made the motion seconded by Mr. Horan. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's report was read for approval. Mr. Horan seconded and Mr. Atwell made the motion. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Mr. Walker moved that Mr Weibezahl be authorized to attend negotiation management Institute of his choice. Mr. Horan seconded. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Mr. Atwell made the motion to authorize Mr. Weibezahl to attend N.Y.S. school boards convention. Mr. Walker seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Dr. Walker moved that Keystone Chorus be granted permission to present a program in the school October 12, 1971. Seconded by Mr. Atwell. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Mr. Atwell moved that Mr. Weibezahl be given permission to close the school Friday, April 21 1973 for County Music Festival. Seconded by Mr. Horan. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Mr. Atwell moved that Geri Callahan Dancing School be allowed to use the school for the academic school year 1971-72. Seconded by Mr. Horan. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Mr. Horan moved that Miss Goodrich be granted permission to teach a course in Family Relationships. Seconded by Mr. Atwell. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Mr. Atwell moved that Miss Sullivan be allowed to teach a course in Speed Reading geared toward college bound students. Seconded by Mr. Walker. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Dr. Walker moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Mr. Horan. Passed by 4 yes votes.

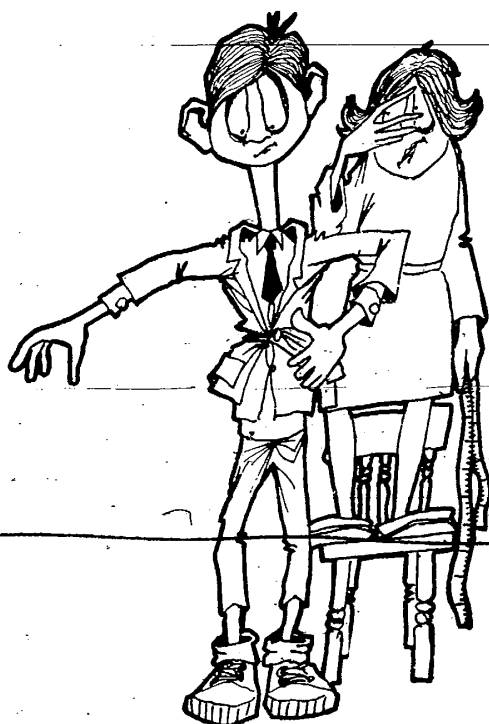
