A Search Is On For New York's Big Trees

If you've ever wondered if that huge tree in the back yard or out in the back forty is the largest of its kind in New York State you'll soon be able to find out.

Environmental Conservation Commissioner Henry L. Diamond said "with the Big Trees Project we hope to not only learn where the biggest trees in New York State are located but also to draw attention to the important part trees play in providing a wholesome environment."

Commissioner Diamond, noting that the project is being sponsored by the State and District Forest Practice Boards in cooperation with the Department of Environmental Conservation said "To compile a directory of Big Trees, as complete and accurate as possible will require the cooperation of many people, particularly the owner of the tree". Commissioner Diamond added, "If you have a tree on your property or know of one that is exceptionally large in height or girth, contact your nearest regional office. A Department forester will be out to measure it".

The last Big Tree census was taken in 1941. Since then the Department has received many inquiries from the public relative to record-sized trees.

New York's big trees will be listed in a national register for comparison with big trees found in other states.

Special "I.D." Sign-up Day For Senior Citizens Dollar Stretcher Plan

The Allegany County Senior Citizens Informational Center, Inc., now has a total of 215 merchants schools and colleges giving discounts on services or merchandise to over 3,000 senior citizens in Allegany County.

The Center is making an all-out effort to reach all who are over 65 of age and would like to have a "Dollar Stretcher Identification Card" for their personal use. Therefore, on September 24, between the hours of 1 and 3 p. m. there will be an additional special sign-up day. The requirements to get such a card are proof of being at least 65 years old (medical card, driver's license, etc.) and 50c.

The "Dollar Stretcher Program" which was initiated in Allegany County by the Informational Center, has resulted in a savings of many thousands of dollars to the elderly, who for the most part, are living on the fixed and/or limited incomes of retirement.

There have been many inquiries to the Center about this popular plan from surrounding area, including Pennsylvania. There are organizations in Steuben and Cattaraugus Counties that are in the process of starting "Dollar Stretcher Plans" in their communities.
