Commissioner Diamond, noting that the project is being sponsored by the State and District Forest Practice Boards in cooperation with the Department of Environmental Conservation said "To compile a directory of Big Trees, as complete and accurate as possible will require the cooperation of many people particularly the owner of the tree".
