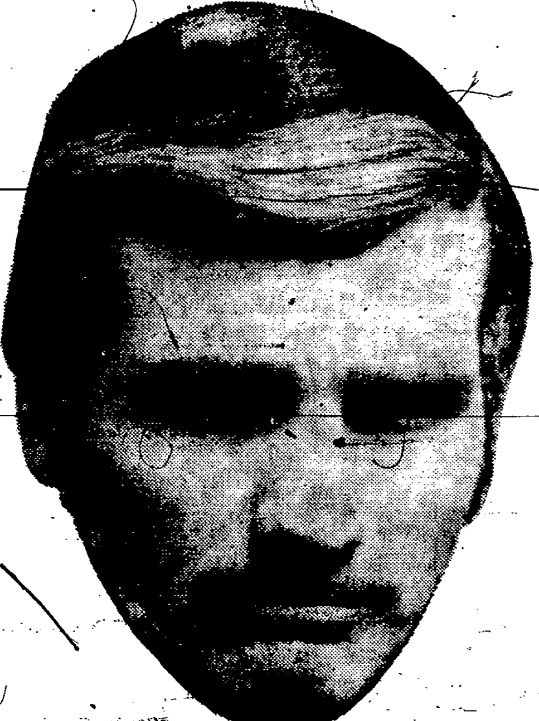
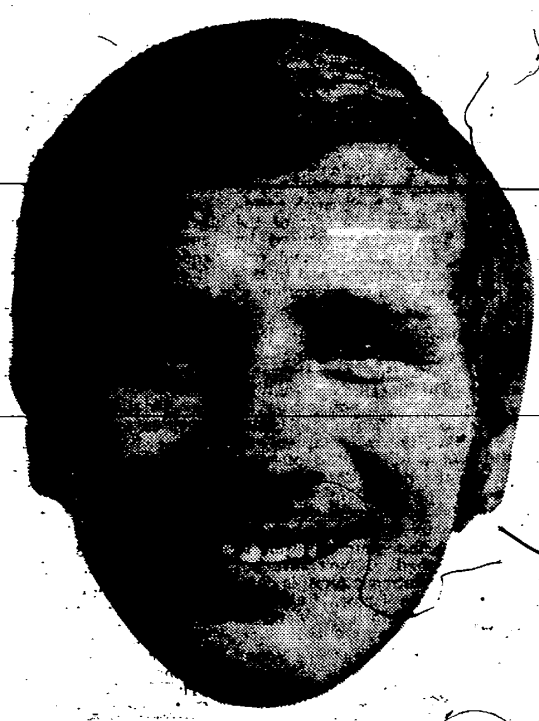
Mr. Hussey was District Supt. of Schools in Steuben County for 25 years and Head of the Education Dept., of Roberts Wesleyan College for 7 years.
