Duck Season

from January 8 - 23. During that time five scaup per day may be taken and 10 kept in possession. The goose and brant season, during which the limits of three and six and six and 12 respectively, may be taken, also runs through to January 23, 1972.

Mergansers, outside the regular duck limits, may be taken at the rate of five and 10 during a regular duck season anywhere in the State. Hooded mergansers still are limited to one per day and two in possession, as has been their status for some time.

The special sea-duck season for scoters, elders and old squaws will continue in the Long Island region from September 25 through January 10, 1972, when seven per day (14 in possession) may be taken. Boundaries of this area are the same as they have been since 1968.

VA Advises Vets On Selling Homes

Washington — Any veteran who sells a home purchased with a GI loan should get a "release of liability" before the sale is completed according to the Veterans Administration (VA).

The veteran may sell his home to any veteran or non-veteran, but before he signs the sales contract, he should request release from further liability to the government from the VA office that guaranteed his home loan.

Unless a veteran specifically asks and receives a "release of liability" from the VA, he will be held responsible for satisfactory completion of the initial GI loan obligation if the new purchaser fails to make the monthly payments.

The VA may issue such a release if the loan is current and the veteran's purchaser agrees to assume the veteran's liabilities. The VA must also be satisfied that the

and include Long Island and Block Island Sounds, and associated bays eastward from a line running between Miamogue Point in the town of Riverhead to Red Cedar Point in the town of Southampton, and including any ocean waters south of Long Island. This does not include any south shore bays. This is the same area in which crippled waterfowl may be shot from a boat under power, as a conservation measure to prevent wastage of a resource in waters where retrieval is a problem. Upstate, sea ducks may be taken only during the regular duck seasons, but bag and possession limits are the liberal seven and 14 in addition to the basic duck bag.

Hunters are reminded that the special scaup season and bonus and the special blue-winged teal bonus are temporary concessions from the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife in relaxing restrictions on species in good supply. However, hunters are warned to be particularly careful in identifying ducks at these times, since there may be other ducks in the same waters which may not be taken. It is up to hunters to understand and abide by the rules of the game.

If waterfowl hunters cannot or do not distinguish between ducks in limited supply and those that are abundant, bag limits for all species will have to be set low enough to be tolerable to the least abundant species.

Shooting hours for all seasons and all species are one-half hour before sunrise to sunset. All waterfowl hunters 16 years of age and older must have a Federal duck stamp.

Several aids to duck identification are available. The colored booklet, "Ducks at a Distance," is available from the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, for 25c. There are also several good small pocket editions to be obtained at newsstands. A new black and white leaflet, "Duck Identification Guide for Hunters," and "Tables of Sunrise and sunset" can be obtained free at all Department of Environmental Conservation Fish and Wildlife offices. The Department urges the use of binoculars, a good bird book and some experience with the birds before the shooting starts. A good rule is: "Know your bird before you shoot — or don't pull the trigger."

Under certain conditions the veteran may have his loan guarantee eligibility restored if the new purchaser obtains his own financing to buy the home rather than assuming the veteran's GI loan.

The veteran should consult any VA office or veterans service organization representative for details of "release of liability" and restoration of GI home loan guarantees.

Notice To Harborers Or Owners Of Dogs

Dog Licenses are due January 1st, 1971. They may be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office.

The law requires that dogs be licensed by January 1. Failure to obtain a license subjects the owner to a penalty of \$10.00 and costs and the dog is liable to seizure.

The Commissioner of Health has issued an order requiring all dogs six months of age or over in the County to be vaccinated to prevent rabies. Therefore an applicant for a dog license must present to the Clerk a certificate certified by a duly licensed veterinarian showing that the dog has been so vaccinated.

To be acceptable, the certificate presented must show that a modified live virus vaccine was used within four years immediately preceding the application date, or that killed vaccine of brain tissue or brain tissue origin was used within the year immediately preceding the application date.

If your application is mailed to the Clerk, the vaccination certificate must accompany your application and check.
