PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED ORDINANCE SPECIAL MEETING OCTOBER 26, 1971

A public hearing on the proposed ordinance for no parking on the streets within designated times and periods was held at the Village Office Oct. 26th, 1971.

The Meeting was opened by Mayor Kessler.

Mr. Finia Crawford, Paul Kilbane, Lasca Congelli, Regina Brown, Ann McAndrew, Howard McAndrew, Michael Brace, Richard Wittle and John Joyce were present. Each gave their opinions and views as to why they opposed this ordinance. Discussion was held, and action was tabled until Friday night, October 29th at 7:30.

Mayor Kessler declared the public hearing closed and called for a special meeting.

Moved by Elmo Barden and seconded by Robert Baker to have a public information meeting on the proposed sewer project on November 12th for District No. 1 and November 13th for District No. 2 at 8 o'clock at the Andover Central School Auditorium.

SPECIAL MEETING OCTOBER 29, 1971

A special meeting of the Village of Andover, Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office October 29th, 1971 at 7:30.

Those present: James Kessler, Mayor; Robert Baker, William Dunham, Glenn Thorp and Elmo Barden, trustees.

WHEREAS a public hearing has been held on Article VII of the Village traffic and no parking ordinance

ORDINANCE FOR NO PARKING ON THE STREETS WITHIN DESIGNATED TIMES AND PERIOD

The following additions are made to section 9, parking time limited within the highways of the Village of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y.

6. No person shall park or leave any vehicle on any street of the Village of Andover between the hours of 2 A. M. to 6 A. M. from the 15th day of November to the 15th day of April.

PENALTY Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$2.00 nor more than \$10.00 for each violation of this ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, on a motion by Robert A. Baker and seconded by William Dunham be it resolved that article VII of the traffic and parking ordinance is hereby adopted and will take effect on the 15th of November after publication and posting as required by law. The poll of votes on this resolution: James Kessler, Aye; Robert Baker, Aye; William Dunham, Aye; Glenn Thorp, Aye and Elmo Barden, Nay, Carried.

Moved by William Dunham, seconded by Glenn Thorp, the following resolution was duly made and adopted by unanimous vote of all members present and voting:

WHEREAS the Village of Andover having a contract with the Power Authority of the State of New York for said Authority to furnish 700 kilowatts of power to said Village;

WHEREAS, the Village of Andover's power requirements have increased;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Village of Andover requests the Power Authority of the State of New York to increase its 700 kilowatts of firm power and energy to 1000 kilowatts

Moved by Elmo Barden and seconded by Glenn Thorp for Richard Schrader to attend Justice School in Buffalo for 3 week-ends beginning November 12th and ending November 27th, with expenses to be paid by the Village. Justice court will be held on Friday evenings at 7 P. M. until further notice. Carried.

Mr. Weibezahl will discuss the possibility of re-activating wrestling team, if there should be a sufficient number available or interested. Otherwise the mat should be sold as it is deteriorating.
