Safety Before Pleasure

As you all know, we have been blessed with snow. Snow provides many recreations. Among these recreations is snowmobiling. I would like to take this opportunity to express my feelings toward this pastime.

Snowmobiling is a very rewarding hobby. It provides many hours of mental relaxation. However, there are some precautions that have to be taken before one can enjoy himself (Very few people actually do this).

First of all, a person should know the correct way to operate the machine. It isn't a toy. Once you are on a snowmobile, you had better know how to maneuver it. If you don't, you may be in for a big surprise.
