First of all, a person should know the correct way to operate the machine. It isn't a toy. Once you are on a snowmobile, you had better know how to maneuver it. If you don't, you may be in for a big surprise.

Secondiy, one should obey every rule which concerns snowmobiles. The New York State Conservation Law now requires children 10 to 16 years of age to earn a snowmobile safety certificate and have it with them when operating a snowmobile without the supervision of an adult them when operating a snowmobile without the supervision of an adult A safety course is being taught locally and anyone may sign up for it in the Andover Central School Office. These safety rules were made for the benefit of the public, not to harm it. Not all rules were made to break. It these rules didn't have some purpose I'm sure that they wouldn't exist.

Most important of all. however Most important of all. however is that each and every person when riding should have respect for him self and for his fellow man.
