At the regular meeting of the Greenwood Central School Board of Education meeting it was the Board's decision to allow employees who worked only a few hours per week to participate in the school health insurance plan provided they wish to pay the full premium themselves.

A letter of resignation was received from Mrs. Shea Kunold, Art teacher, due to personal reasons effective November 23, 1971. This resignation was accepted.

Two of the Board members agreed to have a policy ready for the next Board meeting regarding students riding to and from games on the buses.

The Clerk was authorized to transfer \$1,000 from the General Fund to the School Lunch Fund. This is part of the amount budgeted.

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
