Mrs. Margaret Rollins was given a surprise birthday party at her (Continued on Page 4)

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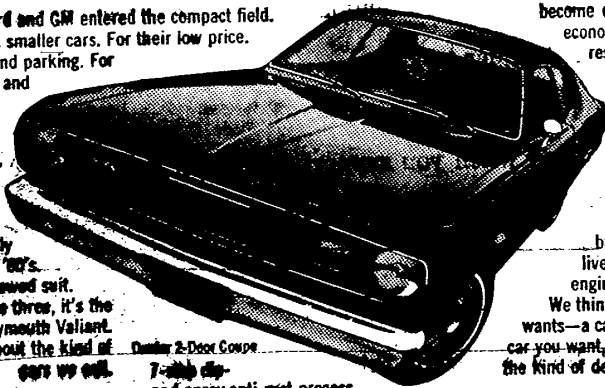
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
