LATE NEWS FLASH Local Sewer Vote "Down The Drain" By A 6-1 Margin

Today's vote on the Sewer System Referendum was overwhelmingly voted down by a 6-1 majority by the Residents of Andover.

Despite the rainy weather, 519 voters turned out at the polls to cast their ballot for and against the proposed sewer system which had been pushed by the Village Board — despite the fact that no Federal or State Aid was available. The final tally showed 426 votes No; 71 votes — yes; with 22 votes void. (This could have been done by people voting for the first time who may have pulled a lever down — and then pushed it back up again, before opening the curtain so that the votes would not have registered on the voting machine.)

Neither the Mayor nor the majority of Village Board Members were present when the vote was tabulated, so no official statement concerning the referendum was available.
