

## Voters Approve B.O.C.E.S. Plan \$915,500 Addition

Local and County-wide Voters yesterday approved the B.O.C.E.S. (Board of Cooperative Educational Services) plan for a \$915,500 school addition to their present Andrew F. Haynes Occupational Center located on the Belmont-Angelica road just outside the Village of Belmont.

Out of a total of 2,503 votes cast in the County, 1,579 votes were yes (for the new addition) and 924 votes no (against). Here locally, 157 votes were cast but a breakdown of the votes for each of the 13 school districts has not been made public by school officials.

The present \$1.2 million plant was completely paid for in two years and plans call for the funding of the new addition as follows: State funds committed — \$416,300; Federal aid — \$322,280; with the local cost of \$176,920 to be divided among the 13 school districts, to be paid for within 2-3 years.

Local voters should feel proud of their favorable vote which carried the local school district and showed the local young people that the Taxpayers "DO CARE" about their education.

From the New York State Fish and Game Law, page 23, ec. 186 par (4) From Dec. 1st to May 31st (a) any Conservation Officer, Dog Warden, Forest Ranger or member of the State Police, anywhere in the state, and (b) any member of any Town Police within the limits of the town of which he is an officer, (c) — or any member of a police force or department of any County, City, Town or Village in which he has jurisdiction and is regularly employed MAY KILL ANY DOG PURSUING OR KILLING DEER.

(5) No action for damage shall be against any person for the killing of a cat or dog as provided in this section.
