

School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday evening, December 13, by the President, Conner Stephens. Mr. Weibezahl and the following Board Members were present: Conner Stephens, Francis Horan, Carl Atwell, William Walker, Mrs. Mary K. Slade.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read for approval. Motion to approve these minutes was made by Francis Horan, seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Motion for approval was made by Mary K. Slade, seconded by Francis Horan. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Resolution passed by 5 votes of yes that the bill — in the amount of \$11,458.85, plus electricity against the General Fund for November 1971 as certified by Mr. Weibezahl, be paid. Motion was made by Carl Atwell, seconded by Dr. Walker.

Motion was made by Mary Slade that the Cafeteria bills for \$1,139.62 for November be paid. Motion seconded by Francis Horan. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Motion was made by Dr. Walker that Title I 1971-72 bill for \$509.29 be paid. Seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The monthly cafeteria report was read showing a net loss of \$1,186.18 for November. Motion to file the report with the minutes was made by Francis Horan, seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 5 votes of yes. (Loan from General Fund in amount of \$1,325 was repaid this month.)

A motion was made by Francis Horan to pay the interest only due on New School Bond due on December 15, 1971. The amount of this payment is \$3,600.00. Motion was seconded by Dr. Walker. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's report was read for approval. Mary K. Slade made the motion that the report be accepted as read. Dr. Walker seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Mary K. Slade made the motion to approve the transfer from Title III Unigrant — \$50.00 — the portion of pay allowable for installation of Study Carrels. Carl Atwell seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Francis Horan made the motion to approve the transferring as a loan — from General Fund — to Title I, 1971-72 — \$1,000.00 pending the receipt of the initial 25% of the Grant. This amount is needed to meet payrolls. Mary K. Slade seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Letters of appreciation were received from Joyce Harris, Nancy Potter, Lois Boyer and Nella Potter for conferences recently attended. Francis Horan made a motion to file these letters with the minutes. Mary K. Slade seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Motion was made by Carl Atwell and seconded by Francis Horan that a resolution be passed in order that Mr. Kessler may be employed as a substitute teacher. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Mr. Weibezahl has made inquiries regarding reactivation of a wrestling team. If a wrestling squad were formed some coaches feel that the other sports — basketball, swimming, etc. — would be weakened.

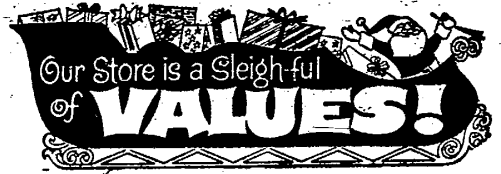
