The Steuben County Republican Committee has recommended James H. Shaut of Greenwood to the County Board of Supervisors to become the GOP County Election Commissioner effective January 1. The announcement was made Friday by State Assemblyman and GOP Committee Chairman Charles P. Henderson of Hornell. Shaut is to replace Fred A. Cornell current GOP Election Commissioner, who is to retire Dec. 31 after several years service.

Shaut was campaign coordinator for the Republican County Committee in this fall's election and is a retired independent businessman, who has worked in real estate in the Greenwood area. He is also Greenwood Town Constable and was a County Supervisor in 1966 and 1967. He is a Hornell native and attended Hornell schools. He is a Navy Veteran who served with the Seabees from 1942 thru 1945. Shaut has been a Republican County Committeeman from Greenwood and served on a GOP area finance committee. He is married to the former Mary Harknider of Rexville. The County Republican Committee recommendation was sent to the Board of Supervisors Friday. The Supervisors are expected to appoint Shaut to a two-year term at their meeting December 30.

The Greenwood Central School Board at the December meeting approved student eligibility procedures. Students who have received a failing mark at the ten weeks marking period are to meet once a week with the teachers of that course to determine if their work is improving or if more help is needed. A warning list is prepared the first week and if the student's work does not improve the second week his name is on the ineligible list making him ineligible for all extra-curricular activities.

For scheduling problems of the building Principal Moore was given flexibility in scheduling use of building by outside groups. It was noted that with boys' Varsity and Junior Varsity basketball, girls' basketball and town team basketball there were few occasions when the gymnasium was not in use.

Moore reported on approval of the sewer project plans and a meeting will be scheduled in the near future with the Board, the two property owners involved and attorney for each. The plan as approved calls for construction of a new 100 foot tile field to remove the effluent from the existing septic tank. The project includes landscaping once the construction is completed.

Prices were adopted for basketball game admission. Season tickets will be sold at \$4 for adults and \$2 for students and individual admission will be \$1 for adults and 50c for students. The season pass will be for both boys and girls

basketball home games. The Board approved spectator buses to away games if there is enough interest to warrant them; if there is enough fuel in the school allocation and if the weather conditions permit. Last year with a cut in fuel allocation the use of spectator buses was curtailed.
