

Robert M. Campbell

Robert M. Campbell, a retired professor of ceramic engineering at the New York State College of Ceramics at Alfred University, died January 5, 1975 at his winter home in Jekyll Island, Ga. He was 75 years old and lived at 30 South Main St., Alfred.

A native of Passaic, N. J., Campbell was a 1923 graduate of the College of Ceramics with a bachelor of science degree in ceramic engineering. Following graduation he spent 10 years as an engineer and plant superintendent in industry.

He returned to the Alfred College of Ceramics as a professor of ceramic technology in 1933.

From 1944 to 1964 Campbell served as chairman of the school's department of ceramic engineering, retiring the following year after 32 years as an administrator and member of the faculty.

Long active in professional organizations, Campbell was a member and Fellow of the American Ceramic Society, a former president of the Steuben Area Chapter of the New York State Society of Professional Engineers, and a former president of the National Institute of Ceramic Engineers.

He was the author of numerous technical articles in his field on subjects related to ceramic white-ware, ceramic engineering education, and materials science. He held the honorary degree of doctor of engineering from Alfred University.

Survivors include his widow Mrs. Anna M. Campbell of Alfred; a daughter, Mrs. J. R. Barney of Endicott; a son Robert M. Campbell of Corning; five grandchildren; three brothers and two sisters.

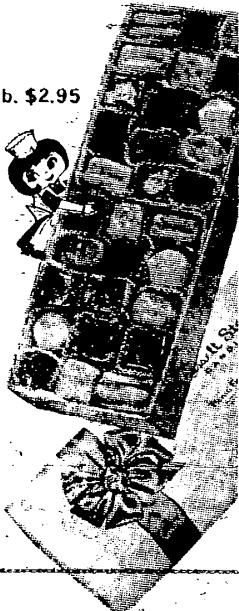
