Well Folks, did you take advantage of the sugar specials last week? If you didn't, and use beet sugar, look for a sharp decline in the near future on this item — so don't try and stock up very much right now.

Did you realize that potatoes are 60¢ a ten pound bag cheaper this year than they were last year at this time? Thus they remain as the best buy in food value today. Onions should hold steady in price for a while longer but the price of lettuce has jumped due to harvesting problems in Arizona and California because of ice in the fields in the mornings.

In the meat line, beef prices are still low for this week and may stay at a current level for a short time longer — so now is the time to stock up.

Solves Science Problem

Probably the most famous experiment that didn't "work" was the so-called Michelson-Morley experiment to detect a supposed ether drift. No such drift was found and upon this negative result, paradoxically, Einstein based his theory of relativity.

The apparatus used in this experiment was called an interferometer and has proved increasingly useful in studying light phenomena. But in general its usage has had the drawback of allowing only one person at a time to view the results.

Intrigued with the use of an interferometer in the study of light but dissatisfied because of its limited use for classroom demonstration area resident, Walter Redmond has developed a type of this instrument that allows a class instructor to demonstrate to a large group simultaneously the various elements of light structure, which are incidentally measured in terms of a few millionths of an inch.

Redmond indicates that the interest shown in this new technological advance by members of the Audio-Visual and Physics Departments at Alfred University have been helpful.
