Greenwood Town Board met recently and discussed the procedure for abandoning Town Roads. Town Attorney, Reginald Sootheran met with the Board. He said if a road has not been worked in six years and the Highway Superintendent signs an affidavit to this effect, the Town can take legal steps to declare the road off the Town Highway System. The Board noted that Steuben County Highway Superintendent Robert Reed has indicated some difference in procedure to be followed. This will be discussed at another meeting. The problem of ownership of old roads is one facing many Townships in the Southern Tier as people are buying land for hunting cabins and vacation homes "back in the hills". These people want to be assured of access and maintenance of these roads, many of which have only been used as farm lanes for many years.

The Board is planning to hold a joint meeting with the Greenwood Central School Board of Education to discuss the meaning of the equalization rate. A representative of the County Treasurer's Office will be the speaker. The Board is also planning further discussion of qualifications for flood insurance.
