Consumer Alert

Allegany County Sealer, George C. Derx, this week urged consumers to "proceed with caution" when buying beef by the bulk or participating in food-freezer programs. As head of the department of Weights and Measurers he explained that the buyer is not always aware that his order is based on "hanging" or gross weight of the carcass, before cutting and trimming — and that the order will shrink "at least, 30 percent, and in many cases much more" when cut into serving pieces.

"Consumers", he said, should not hesitate to ask the seller what the average shrinkage would be so they can compute the edible cut price before buying. They should contact him for consultation before making this type of purchase. He can at least advise, them of some of the hazards of bulk beef buying and possibly save them a lot of disappointment later.

The following is an exact trans-

The following is an exact transcript of the law covering the above program.

CARCASSES OR PARTS OF CARCASSES OF MEATS. A per-son who sells meat directly to the son who sells meat directly to the consumer on the basis of carcasses or parts of carcasses shall supply the buyer with an accurate statement of hanging weight and grade of meat. Such seller, if he cuts up or processes such product, shall at the time of delivery thereof to the huyer supply the buyer with a the buyer supply the buyer with a complete and accurate statement showing the net weight of the meat delivered.

Always sak for and reel frimmings, bones, and fats that have been cut from your carcasses. The total of all these should come to the same weight as what you bought.
