Red Fescue Grass Requires Low Maintenance

A lawn planted with red tescue grasses requires little care and will save the homeowner money and effort, according to a Cornell University turf specialist.

Prof. John E. Kaufmann at the N. Y. State College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, Cornell, says red fescue grasses are not for those who insist that a lawn be a perfect green carpet, but are for those who want an acceptable lawn with a minimum of care.

Red fescue, he points out, requires the least amount of fertilizers, pesticides, and water of any lawn grass variety used in the Northern United States.

It has a special mechanism for conserving water, Kaufmann explains. During long dry periods, the grass stops growing thus coping with moisture stress. When it is in this "summer dormaney", it is not advisable to water it, even though the grass turns brown. "In fact, irregular or improer watering could "confuse" the natural mechanism of dormancy causing complete kill of the grass." he warns. "The brown turf will recover when cooler, damper weather arrives." No mowing is necessary during the dormant stage.

As for fertilizer requirements,

As for fertilizer requirements, apply 10 pounds of 10-10-10 fertilizer per 1.000 square feet in early September. If half the amount is applied in early fall and the rest in mid-fall, a greater efficiency of fertilizer is obtained.

Close mowing can ruin the lawn

Close mowing can ruin the lawn Kaufmann warns. The proper cutting height is two inches or slightly higher, and the rule of the thumb is not to cut off more than one-third of the grass less at any one-mowing. Frequent mowing is recommended so that clippings never need to be removed; keep the mower sharp to avoid damage to the grass plant.

Red thread and leafspot are the most serious diseases of red fescues; browning and thinning of the lawn from these diseases may occur in the spring or fall in a bad year, but recovery is usually quite

"Only in severe cases is it necessary to use a fungicide," Kaufmann says.

Home lawns with other types of grasses can be transformed into a low level of maintenance. The first step is to stop using fertilivers pesticides, and water throughout the growing season; remove ex-cessive thatch with a de-thatchine machine in spring or fall. Each fall, seed bare areas with red

fescues.
Red fescues are very fine bladed rasses giving a more "thread-like" appearance than bluegrasses. They establish more rapidly from seed than do bluegrasses, but they do not establish rapidly by vegetative means. Therefore, bare soots in a lawn will not fill in as rapidly as can be expected from bluegrasses. Reseeding may become more necessary than before, Kaufmann says. mann says.
