Well Shoppers, sugar prices are still declining gradually as we had predicted, so this is one sweet note for all you people with that "sweet tooth".

In the produce line, the fall potato storage crop still remains with lower prices reported — although shipments of Florida Winter Crop Potatoes have begun at much higher prices. Iceberg lettuce prices are still holding steady — with fresh cauliflower being featured this week at a much lower market price. In the fresh fruit line, Florida Grapefruit and California Navel Oranges are being featured again.

In the meat Department, Beef is still down "boneless chuck roast" at less than \$1 per pound and "ground beef" on extra special at 59c. In the Pork line, prices are still steady with "pork steak" at 99c and "pork roast" & "Country style sausage" both at 89c; and stewing chickens are still holding steady at 59c.

Special Note — For those of you who enjoy stuffed peppers — here is a chance for a tasty treat as green peppers are on special at 10c each, and with the low price on ground beef well, there you are!
