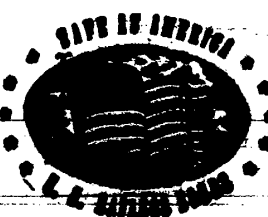

## State Assembly To Study Plans On Air Pollution

The State Assembly plans legislation on developing systems to recycle garbage and refuse that would produce needed fuel and other useful products, create new jobs and reduce air pollution.

Public hearings to help develop the specific legislative program to formalize State policy on solid waste management and resource recovery will be held beginning March 18, according to Assembly Speaker Stanley Steingut.

"Work now being done by the State's Department of Environmental Conservation demonstrates that a system of facilities to recover resources from water can offer significant environmental and economic benefits to local communities and the entire state," Steingut said. "With the cooperation and support of Environmental Commissioner Ogden Reid, the Assembly intends to expedite resource-recovery projects already under way and develop a comprehensive statewide policy for greater efficiency and benefit."

The concept under consideration would drastically reduce the need for landfills and incinerators and replace them with a network of facilities to extract useful components from waste.

Steingut said potential benefits of such a statewide system include:

Extracting from waste the equivalent of up to 17 million barrels of fuel oil - about 25 per cent of the total consumption of all the state's utility companies.

Producing about 1.5 million tons of iron and steel, 60,000 tons of aluminum, one million tons of glass, and 60,000 tons of copper, tin, lead and zinc.

Creating about 5,000 new jobs. Reducing air pollution by 15,000 tons of impurities per year.

"We want New York State to lead the nation in resource recovery from waste," Steingut said. "The purpose of our hearings is to gather and analyze materials from the Department of Environmental Conservation and local communities on what is needed to move further ahead."

Assisting the Environmental Conservation Committee of the Assembly will be Robert Rickles, former New York City Commissioner of Air Resources.

Joining Steingut and Reid at the announcement of plans for the legislative program were Assemblymen Herbert A. Posner, Chairman, and Angelo Orazio, member of the Assembly Environmental Conservation Committee; Assemblyman G. Oliver Koppell, Chairman of the Majority Program Committee; and State Senator Carol Bellamy, ranking member of the Senate Conservation and Recreation Committee.
