Hello there all you grocery shoppers. What's the word this week? Well, if you like, beef — buy beef! The nation's beef herd is at an all-time high, in fact predictions are that it will be up 8 - 10% for the next few months. However, compared with recent years, more beef will be grass-fed and less grain-fed, and, this means that more of it will be graded as good — instead of choice or prime and won't be as tender.

If supplies of pork, lamb, poultry and eggs are reduced, this means that these prices will rise — and with beef more in demand — then beef prices will more than likely increase slowly. Thus, if you have freezer storage space, now seems to be the best time to stock up!

With California vegetables hitting their peak production for the season, fresh Broccoli, Iceberg Lettuce, Spinach and Green Onions are being featured at low prices this week with Florida tube tomatoes remaining about the same at 39c a package.

One of the unfortunate items on today's market is bound to keep rising and this necessary product is the complete dairy line. As feed prices rise — so does the price of milk, and the rest of the items made from it so, until cattle can be grass-fed, you can not expect anything but a slow rise in dairy prices.

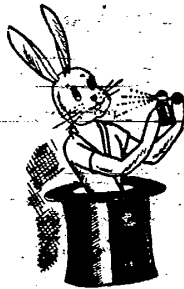
