## Belmont Site For Second Medical Center

The Board of Directors of the Rural Management Association of Allegany County, Inc., passed a motion at its March 27 meeting designating Belmont as the site for its second medical center.

The center will be established July 1, according to Robert L. Love of Alfred, president of the association which assists in providing health care in under-served areas of the county and undertakes health planning projects.

He noted that the association's long range planning committee has been charged with exploring sites for the new center and that the facility will have the services of physicians, nurses, and other health care personnel as needed.

Word had been received from Belmont Rotary Club indicating its desire for the association to select Belmont as the site for the center and indicating that the community and club pledged support to assist the association in this project, according to Love.

In other business at the meeting, the building committee reported it has been examining a variety of plans submitted for consideration for the new center to be built in Andover.

Love reported that the Comprehensive Health Planning Council of Western New York has notified the board that the Hospital Review and Planning Council of the State has approved the Andover building plan and authorized the board to proceed with its planning.

Love noted that a survey of the health needs of the association parishes in Andover is under way and that definite plans about the structure itself should be formulated in the near future. The Association president also noted that no builder has as yet been selected.

Currently, the Andover Center is located in temporary facilities on Main Street in the village.
