BRIEF HISTORY OF ANDOVER LIONS CLUB

The Andover Lions Club was organized in the fall of 1971 under the guidance of Lions Club District Governor Mayo Wright and Extension Chairman Skip Dunham; was sponsored by the Wellsville Lions Club with Ralph "Red" Allen serving as organizational chairman in Andover; and received its official charter in February, 1972.

With Charter President "Red" Allen at the helm, along with the terrific cooperation of the other forty-nine Charter Members, the new Club immediately turned loose a great deal of "pent-up" energy and set forth on the International Lions Club Program under the banner: "We Serve" which includes taking an active interest in the civic, social and moral welfare of the community.

Many projects that benefited the community included the sponsorship of the local Girl Scout organization, sending boys to Conservation Camp, Scout Camp and Basketball Clinics; holding Lazy Eye Clinics; Easter Egg Hunts for the community children; donating a large sum of money to the Senior Citizens after the disastrous flood of '72; purchasing portable bleachers and glass backboards for Andover Central School; and donating an EKG machine to the Andover Medical Center. In addition to these major projects, the Lions Club performed many other community activities and services throughout the two years.

The Presidency was turned over to "Tom" Smith on July 1, 1973, which saw the Club grow to sixty-four members consisting of fifty active members and fourteen members-at-large.

The Club continued its far-reaching projects such as its junk car collection for ecology, Glaucoma Clinics, participation in the 4th of July Celebration and Christmas Baskets for the Needy of the community.

The Andover Lions Club is again sponsoring the annual Allegany-Steuben Maple Festival and Honey Show, a vast undertaking requiring thousands of man-hours in planning and execution under the Chairmanship of Lion President Tom Smith and Past President Red Allen.

Many new Club activities are planned for the spring such as a village "clean-up" operation, organizing a Leo's Club (a youth organization for serving the community), and a major patriotic project. Also, another Lazy Eye Clinic will be held this spring along with a Hearing Clinic.

The success of the Andover Lions Club is due to the time, devotion and willingness of the entire membership to tackle the needs of the community and stick with it until success is attained — and, to all those people in the entire community area who have faithfully supported and contributed to the many fund-raising projects.
