LIONS URGE PARENTS Offer Free Lazy Eye Clinic

The Andover Lions Club will hold a free lazy eye screening clinic Saturday and Sunday at the Steuben-Allegany Maple Festival, April 5 & 6.

Lazy eye is a condition that, if left untreated, could cause the loss of some vision in one eye. The best time to begin treatment is usually about the time a child starts school.

The Lions are urging parents with pre-school children, ages 3 to 5, to bring them to the Maple Festival and go through the screening program. The screening procedure takes about 10 minutes.

The clinic will be located in the Andover Central School in the Nurse's Office. Hours will be 10:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday and noon to 4:00 p.m. on Sunday. Adults may also stop in for a quick vision check.

LIONS MEMBERS RECEIVE TRAINING

On Monday, March 3, nine Andover Lions participated in a training program utilizing the Andover Central School vision testing machine. The training program was designed to familiarize the Lions with the vision testing machine so that they could use it to screen for lazy eye in pre-school children and to screen adults.

Lazy eye is a condition that can cause the loss of vision in one eye. If the lazy eye condition is discovered in time the eye can be trained so that minimal or no loss of sight will result. The best time to begin treatment for lazy eye is usually before a child enters kindergarten.

The Lions are especially grateful to Charity McCormick, A.C.S. school nurse—teacher, who donated her time to conduct the training session.
