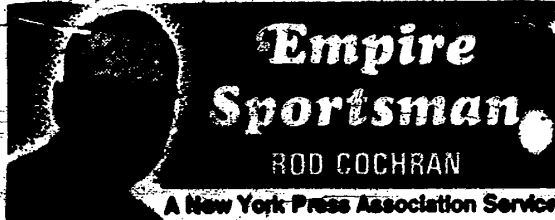

TROUT LOWDOWN

No matter how much fun it is to
catch trout on the surface with
dry flies, it still pays to remember
that 90 per cent of a trout's life
is spent feeding at varying depths
below the surface. Particularly
early in the season, the fishing
lowdown is to fish low down!

In recent years nymph fishing
has become much more popular
with trout anglers, and that is be-
cause these little imitations of
aquatic insects catch a lot of fish.
Drifted along the bottom - with
as much care and freedom from
drag as dry flies - and occasion-
ally lifted toward the surface as if
they were swimming, they will
often put trout in a feeding mood.
This is not easy fishing, for you
seldom feel or see a strike - just
a resitation in the float of your
line may mean a fish.

All this came to mind recently
when I was comparing fishing
takes with Dick Jennings at the
Cortland Line Co. They had just
announced the development of
three densities of sinking fly lines,
that offer anglers the ultimate in
flexibility - medium sinking, fast
sinking, and extra fast sinking
lines. While nymph and wet fly
fishing can be done in shallow
stream with floating lines, and
sink-tip lines which Cortland dis-
covered and introduced, the sink-
ing lines are used in deeper water.

"The major difference in fishing
with sinking rather than floating
lines," Dick explained, "is that
sinking lines must be retrieved be-

fore the next cast. However, this
allows your fly or nymph more
fishing time."

Many of us are apt to fish worms
or lures close to the bottom this
time of year with pinning tackle.
This is fine for little brush-covered
streams that are almost impossible
to fish with any other method.
It is also a good way to take fish
from any water.

Unfortunately, a goodly number
of flyfishermen think they have to
leave their tackle in the closet
until the end of May and either do
not fish spring conditions at all or
feel they have "to use spinning
tackle. A trip or two using
nymphs or small wet flies might
very well change their ways.

The main trick to effective
nymph fishing, as far as I'm con-
cerned, is to fish carefully and to
remain alert. Use the same caution
in approaching the water as you
would use in June. Cast just
as carefully across and a little
downstream, as you would cast
upstream with a delicate dry fly
during the evening hatch. Let the
nymph bounce and tumble along
with the current at the bottom
without a hint of drag. Then, at
the end of your drift hold your
lines and let the current lift your
nymph to the surface as if it's
about to "emerge" and fly into the
air. This can be exciting to trout,
and sometimes they will hit with
 abandon.

And that's the lowdown on fish-
ing low down.
