Andover Scouts Win 2nd Place In Swimoree

Eighty-seven Scouts from eight Scout Troops swam in relays Friday night's Swimoree held at the Brooklyn School pool in Wellsville. In first place was Troop 43 of Houghton, with 32 total points. Andover Troop 42 took second place with 29 total points, and Troop 33 of Wellsville, third place with 25 total points.

The 1975 Swimoree was the second annual meet to be held for the Hiawatha Scouts according to the Swimoree Chairman Rollin Colegrove. Five separate relays were run separately for the eleven and twelve year olds, thirteen and fourteen year olds, and fifteen through seventeen year olds. The two younger age groups swam in a 25 yard Free style relay, a 50 yard Free style relay, a 25 yard Backstroke relay, a 25 yard Breaststroke relay, and a 100 yard Free style relay with four swimmers. Distances for the 15 through 17 year bracket were doubled. The final event was a diving contest, in which the degree of difficulty was multiplied by the performance of the dive.

Troop swimmers received 3 points for taking first place on an event, 2 points for second place and 1 point for third place. All event points were totaled to determine the top three winners.
