Well, folks for a little "peep" into the Produce Market future. Florida Nectarines and amber Peaches will soon be appearing in the market and moderate supplies will continue thru late May, but prices will more than likely be higher than last year.

Most of the fresh market vegetables are reported to have around 10 percent less potential production than a year ago despite an increase in acreage planted due to poor weather. The Texas spring onion crop is reported 17 percent below last year's due to very dry conditions and heavy winds so these prices will be up considerably for the next few months.

In fact, due to bad weather, even the summer potato crop in Virginia is now two to three weeks behind planting schedule with some shipper claiming there is no way to plant their intended acreage. Thus you can even look forward to much higher potato prices once last fall's crop is gone.

This week's specials include low prices for Florida Cabbage and

In the meat line, Chuck Roast is being featured at 59c per pound with Chuck Steaks at 69c and Ground Chuck holding steady at 89c per pound. So, that is just about the story on the grocery front for this week.
