A total of 230 persons were seen on this two-day week-end stop. Seventy-seven persons, or 34% of the total, were found to have some hearing loss, with 7 or 4% of the total found to have loss severe and/or significant enough to warrant referral for medical-otological examination and/or further audiological evaluation.

This was a very successful week-end stop in conjunction with the Maple Festival in Andover, despite the two days of inclement weather. On Sunday, April 6th, 1975, 126 persons were tested on the Mobile Unit. Ninety-eight of those persons had hearing within normal limits. The weather conditions were unusually poor for this time of year, but people continued to come on and off the Unit steadily all day.

I would like to express my appreciation to the Lions Club in supplying a mobile home for a waiting room in order to make persons comfortable while waiting for the testing. I look forward to many more stops in Andover.
