REGENTS SCHOLARSHIP WAR EXAMINATION - 1975 SERIES  
The tentative date of June 30 1975 has been cancelled. We will advise you as soon as we receive word regarding this examination.

CHANGE IN DISCHARGE MAY BRING DENTAL CARE. When a veteran's discharge from military service is changed by competent authority from "under honorable conditions" to "under honorable conditions" the veteran has one year from the date of correction to apply for dental treatment. His application within this period is considered timely, and eligibility is determined in the same manner as for other applicants for dental care.
