

Pastor Appointed To Andover And Whitesville

The Rev. Francis J. Zmoyzinski was appointed pastor of Blessed Sacrament and St. John of the Cross in Whitesville, according to an announcement made by Bishop Edmund Healy, effective May 3, succeeding the Rev. Joseph E. Walker who was appointed pastor of St. Thomas Church in Stockton, Kansas.

Father Zmoyzinski (Father Francis or Father Frank, if you prefer) is a native of Buffalo, attended and graduated from St. John Kuntz Elementary School, St. Joseph High School and the Diocesan Preparatory Seminary. He continued his studies for the priesthood at Niagara University, and furthered his studies for the priesthood at the University of Louisville, Kentucky, receiving his theology degree and was ordained in Louisville, June 28, 1957. During the summer of 1956 he studied in the Holy Land, University of Jerusalem.

Father Zmoyzinski has also taught at St. Mary's High School in Lancaster, taught at Villa Maria College and Institute of Mount, studied and taught at the University of Buffalo, graduated with a Master in Music, also Master in Education degree from U. B., while serving as administrator of St. John Fisher South Dayton, assistant at St. Augustine in Depew, administrator assistant at St. Anthony's in Buffalo, also at St. John Kuntz, assistant at Our Lady of Victory, Buffalo (known as Father Baker's), also served as hospital Chaplain at Our Lady of Victory, and was assistant at Our Lady of the Sacred Heart in Orchard Park, before coming to Andover and he likes the friendly small town people and welcomes everyone to his church.

A combined Parish Picnic to welcome their new pastor will be held on the lawn at the Blessed Sacrament Church, Sunday, June 29 at 1 p. m. A smorgasbord style will be served to all attending.

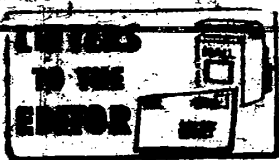
ANDOVER TOPS BOLIVAR 5-2
