Well Folks, despite the fact that we received carming supplies last week, we're out of canning lids again. We have sent copies of a letter received by one of our customers from one of the big canning lid manufactureres to our distributors — and hopefully will receive some news in the near future before canning season is here. In answer to many questions we received from customers in our meat department about meat cuts we will quote some General Meat Terms from a bulletin put out by the U. S. Department of Agriculture? "Ground Beef" — Ground Beef usually is misde from lean, trimmings and the less tender and less popular cuts of beef. When prepared under Federal inspection, the fact content men not except 30% and studient fat may not be knowed the chooped strong are used, the ground beef abould be prepared.

less inside portion of this cut is often cured and smoked.

"Ham" cut taken from the hind leg of a pig. It, may be sold fresh or cured and smoked. Halves — Shank or Butt halves that have none of the "center" section removed. Portions or Ends — the remaining shank to butt portions of halves after the "center" section has been removed. "Center" — thick, nearly round, meatly section which contains only, a small round bone. (More on meat cuts next week).

In. our "buys of the Week", semi-boneless chuck steak is featured at 80c per pound; all meat or beef wieners are going for 70c for a 12-oz, package; and small young turkeys are 60c per pound.

In canned goods — cut wax or green beans are 4 for \$1; canned mushroom are 3 for \$1; and chunk una is 29c

In the vegetable department cucumbers are 2 for 25c and water-melon is still 12c per pound. Well that wraps it up for this week.

Methodist-Presbyterian Parish Vote On Forming **United Church**

United Church

The memberhips of the United Methodist Church and the United Presbyterian Church held a special meeting to vote on a resolution to move toward forming a United Church and to elect Union Plansing Committee to facilitate this by presenting a Plan of Union to life, voted on in the fall. There were 63 Methodist and 47 Presbyterians present for the meeting. A two-thirds majority vote was required to adopt the resolution while would have been 36 Methodist votes and 32 Presbyterian votes. The Methodists approved the resolution by a vote of 38 in favore and 15 capposed to the resolution.

The Presbyterian Church did not.

The Presbyterian Church did not approve the adopting of the resolution by a vote of 26 in favor and 21 opposed. For the time being the Churches wall be continuing so stare in the Cooperative Parksi and Worship Services for the remainder of June will be in the Presbyterian Church. The Worship Services during the mooth of July will be in the Methodist Sahctuary. The Pastor makes the following comment on the result of the vote. I believe the vote represents a real tragedy in the life of the Church as a whole, and is indeed a giant step backward, but hope I am proven to be wrong."
