Lester Ordway was the driver and lost control of the car, causing it to leave the highway on a curve, hit a tree and go over a 20 foot embankment. Ordway was not badly hurt nor hospitalized. Steve Heckman was taken to the Bethesda Hospital with a fractured leg near the hip and ankle and bruises. His breaks were complicated and he was transferred by the Greenwood Ambulance to Highland Hospital in Rochester. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Seymour and aunt, Mrs. Bernice Oerman were called to the Bethesda at 12:30 and went to Rochester with him later. He was holding his own Sunday and in satisfactory condition.

Jerry Quick was the son of Glee Quick and Beverly Teribury Quick of Candor. He was also survived by a sister, Janine and paternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Otto Quick. He was at the H. P. Smith and Son Funeral Home in Canisteo, who were in charge of the funeral arrangements.
