The stitching pattern, adapted from a 1790 quilt, is on a background of continental, blue with the first seals of the original 13 states, plus two other ones of the original United States seals and another of the Liberty Bell, thus having 15 white squares quilted and embroidered.

Mrs. Hitchcock began each seal's research with a rists to the officer of the Secretary of State of each state then onto archives and museums. She completed the quilt with each seal exactly duplicated in pattern and color.

This double-bed-size quilt has been appraised at \$22,000, because of its distorical significance. In no other single place can the 13 guiggost state seals be found in tolor except on this beautiful puilt. No commercial profit can be made of this quilt, nor can it
