Donald H. Cibbs To Retire Sept. 1 From Alfred Ag-Tech

Donald H. Gibbs, director of admissions at State University Agricultural and Technical College at Alfred since 1962, will retire September 1 after more than 30 years in education.

Mr. Gibbs, former guideance director at Androver, Scio and Whiteswille Central Schools began his career in education in 1940. Except for three years of Army service 1943 to 1946 he has been an educator since 1949.

During 13 years at Alfred State College, Mr. Gibbs saw enrollment more than the same as a new \$35 million west Side Campus was developed, a vocational division of the college established in Wellswille and an estimation program inaugurated in Cattaraugus County.
