## Grocery Gems & Goodies

Well folks, does the heat have you "stizzled up to a frazzle" or "frazzled up to a frizzle"?

Let's seen now, in our discussion on different meat cuts, guess we left off with Delmonico and forgot to mention Club steak. Club steaks are bone-in beef steak from the rib end of the loin section and are also called rib steaks.

London Broil is no specific cut but usually a beef flank steak. It generally is broiled and served in thin diagonal slices. Other less tender cuts also may be sold as London Broil to be prepared in a similar manner.

Strip Steak is the beef short loin portion with the tenderloin muscle removed. A strip steak is the same as Porterhouse or T-Bone steak without the tenderloin muscle and with the bone removed, and is sometimes called a boneless strip steak.

Swiss Steak is not a specific cut but a method of preparation. Usually applied to less tender beef steaks which should be prepared by moist heat cookery. Such cuts frequently are mechanically tenderized by running thru a machine with sharp blades which cut part way thru the tough meat tendons.
