That Shiny Green Bug Is Probably A Japanese Beetle

A shiny, metallic green bettic that devours roses is the Japaness beetle and it is making its annual appearance now in New York

State.

These beetles spend about 10 months of a year in the ground and emerge around the middle of summer to feed on leaves, flowers, and fruit of plants and trees exposed to bright light, says Ms. Carolyn Klass, Cooperative Extension specialist in entomology at the N. Y. State College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, Cornell University.

Active on warm sunny days, the beetles move rapidly from plant to plant of sewing the tissue between the veins of a leaf, messing on ripening truft and eating the silk of corn as fast as it grows. They especially tike rose flowers and grape leaves. More than 275 different plants are atacked in the United States.

First found in New Jersey in 1916, the beetles have spread to southern Maine in the north, southward into South Carolina and Georgia, and westward into Kentucky. Hilmois, Michigan, and Missouri.

During the 10 months spent in the ground in the form of a white grub, they feed on the roots and underground stems of plants, particularly grasses. They frequently do serious damage to lawns and often go unnoticed until dead patches appear.

Ms. Klass says the beetles and Ms. Klass says the beetles and grubs are controlled naturally by a milky disease and by parasites, and a dry summer helps suppress them. A wet summer encourages development of eggs and grubs, and increased numbers of beetles usually appear the next year. The milky-disease which kills the grubs is available to homeowners since it has been incomporated into a dust by manufacurers

The foliage and fruit of most plants can be protected if necessary from the chewing beetle by spraying with carbaryl, Klass advises. All parts of the foliage must be covered and more than one application may be necessary especially if heavy rains occur.

When the insecricides applied to edible plants, Klass warns gardeners they must observe the required waiting period between the last application and harvest. The waiting time is specified on the container label.

When only a few plants are at tacked, the bectles can be knocked into a jer or bucket containing water and a little kerosene. This must be done every day, preferably early in the morning when it is cool and the beetles are quiet.

Klass says beetles are active for four to six weeks and then they for four to six weeks and then they gradually disappear, but some may be seen until frost. Gardeners having a particularly bed problem with them can seek advice from their local county Cooperative Extension agent.
